A SUCCESSFUL TRIP TO RAINBOW HOPE CENTRE!

Roy and Andy have had a brilliant trip to see the children in Uganda. They managed to take around 135 kg of your very generous donations with them to the orphanage and had an extremely busy and overwhelming week.

The first major change is that the orphanage now has a name! We have called it Rainbow Hope Centre and the children have loved helping design the logo by drawing their own pictures!

Change number two is that all of the buildings are now built and are fully functional. The site now consists of a dormitory which is split in half (for boys and girls), a kitchen, storage room, dining hall, office, house mother's bedroom, a toilet and a bathroom. The children are all living in the orphanage now, and are loving their new home equipped with bright bedding, bunk beds, lots of clothes and a brand-new playground!

Some banana plants have been planted, however we plan to make the orphanage self- sufficient in terms of growing their own crops and breeding their own livestock, so lots more will be happening in the near future!





The final major change is that the children have all started school, some for the first time! This is all thanks to the amazing support HUG has. You are really helping to make a difference to these children's lives!

Our night watchman and handyman is called Kabanda Rogers, married with four children-2boys and 2girls. He is staying at the orphanage throughout the night to ensure the children are safe. He is also helping out with any jobs that need tending to.

We are going to set up a child sponsorship program so that you can sponsor one of our orphans through their education. Education in Uganda is so much cheaper in comparison to England; therefore, our aim is to put each of our children through as much education as they want! - Purchase ½ acre of land for sustainable living and livestock.

- Paint the dormitories.
