End of year results

Schooling and the education system in Uganda differs to how we do it here in England. If a child is making progress, they go to the next year group, regardless of age. If they are struggling or are new to schooling due to not being able to afford school fees previously, they start in year one (P1). This means that many of our children have started school in P1, even though they all differ in age. Our children have been working hard all year at school and many have been 'promoted' to the next year group. We even have one little star who is top of the class and has been awarded 1st out of 77 children!

Some of our children are going to be having extra tuition to help them improve in areas they find difficult. We have also hooked up lighting in all of the seating areas at Rainbow Hope Centre, which will now ensure children can complete their homework easily after school.







A Big Thankyou

Over Christmas we have been lucky enough to have led a number of fund raising projects, which have put us in a fantastic position for the start of 2018. The Holmes Chapel Christmas market raised £165 and the Alsager light switch on stall made a huge £253.50 - it was lovely to see so many familiar faces and to be able to chat to new people about our projects.
